- The apple tree originated in Central Asia.













- · Birds have feathers, wings, lay eggs and are warm blooded.

- The chicken is the most common species of bird found in the world.















- A group of cats is called a clowder, a male cat is called a tom, a female cat is called a molly or queen while young cats are called kittens.











- Fish are covered in scales which are often covered in a layer of slime to help their movement through water.













- Gorillas are the largest living Primate. Humans are also primates.

- Like humans Gorillas have 5 toes on each foot and 5 fingers on each hand.
















- Horses can sleep both lying down and standing up.

- Because horse's eyes are on the side of their head they are capable of seeing nearly 360 degrees at one time.



- Tail is used mainly for defense (iguana can punch its enemy with tail). In the case of danger, iguana can detach a part of its tail to ensure fast escape from predator.














- Although the word is mentioned in their name, jellyfish are not fish.













 Kangaroos have very powerful legs and can be dangerous at times.









- Lions are the second largest big cat species in the world (behind tigers).
- The average male lion weighs around 180 kg (400 lb) while the average female lion weighs around 130 kg (290 lb).
- The heaviest lion on record weighed an amazing 375 kg (826 lb).
- Lions can reach speeds of up to 81 kph (50 mph) but only in short bursts because of a lack of stamina.
- The roar of a lion can be heard from 8 kilometers (5.0 miles) away.
- Most lions found in the wild live in southern and eastern parts of Africa.













- · A group of foxes is called a skulk or leash.





The yo-yo is a popular toy made with of a length of string tied at one end to a flat spool. It is used by holding the free end of the string (usually by inserting one finger in a slip knot) and pulling at it so as to cause the spool to turn while it is hanging in mid-air, either winding or unwinding the string. It first became popular in the 1920s.

In the simplest play, the string is wound on the spool by hand. The yoyo is then thrown downwards, so that it goes down and unwinds the string. It then (by inertia) climbs back, winding the string up. Finally the yo-yo is grabbed, ready to be thrown again.
